

Kowloon, Hong Kong Tel: (852) 3128 8668 If your visa has expired or if you are in Hong Kong illegally and should you wish to seek non-refoulement protection under the USM, please approach the General Investigation Section (GIS) of the Immigration Department (ImmD) and "surrender" voluntarily.

You may have to wait for one week for an appointment.



After completion of the procedures at the GIS a removal order will be issued against you and you will be detained for verification and investigation.

The detention period may vary on a case by case basis. Most cases are resolved in a matter of weeks and only in certain circumstances will cases take longer.



You should make a formal written application at this time clearly stating: 1) Your country of origin,

2) Why you fear return and what harm you may face, and

3) Hong Kong mailing address and mobile number.

* The application can be written in your own language.



Once ImmD concludes its investigation, a Recognizance document(RD) may be issued to you. The recognizance document is not a visa and simply provide you with conditional release. You cannot access material assistance without a RD.



If your application is accepted, the ImmD will mail you a "Notice to persons making a non-refoulement claim" and give you an appointment to take your fingerprints and photograph and provide a briefing of the relevant procedures.

It may take a few weeks before you receive this from the ImmD.




You will be fingerprinted and photographed and a Duty Lawyer will be appointed to you. The ImmD will provide you with a Non-refoulement Claim Form.

The form needs to be completed and returned within 28 days with the assistance of a Duty Lawyer.



Screening interview

Material Assistance

Please register with the Social Welfare Department (SWD). You may be asked to show confirmation of your USM claim. If you do not have any written confirmation, SWD may obtain your consent to contact ImmD for verification directly.

① The confirmation process may take some time.

Once confirmation has been obtained by SWD, they will refer your case to International Social Service (ISS) via fax

refer your case to International Social Service (ISS) via fax. You will be able to obtain a medical waiver for medical treatment at public hospitals if required.





ISS will contact you and give an appointment for an in-take interview.

You may have to wait for a few weeks before you are given an in-take interview. No assistance will be available during the waiting period but you may approach the ISS office for emergency food. Once ISS has conducted an in-take interview, you may be provided with food and shelter.

If you already have a Recognizance Document(RD) and if you wish to seek non-refoulement protection under the USM, you should make a formal written application stating:

- 1) Your country of origin,
- 2) Why you fear return and what harm you may face, and
- 3) Hong Kong mailing address and mobile number.
- * The application can be written in your own language.



You should mail the application to the Removal Assessment Section of the Hong Kong Immigration Department directly.

If your application is accepted, the ImmD will mail you a "Notice to persons making a non-refoulement claim" and give you an appointment to take your fingerprints and photograph and provide a briefing of the relevant procedures.

It may take a few weeks before you receive this from the ImmD.



You will be fingerprinted and photographed and a Duty Lawyer will be appointed 4 to you. The ImmD will provide you with a Non-refoulement Claim Form.



Social Assistance

In order to receive social assistance, you need to have a recognizance document and an open USM claim (received the Notice to persons making a non-refoulement claim").

STEP 1: Social Welfare Department

You must first register with the Social Welfare Department (SWD). You may be asked to show confirmation of your USM claim. If you do not have any written confirmation, SWD may obtain your consent to contact ImmD for verification directly. (The confirmation process may take some time) Once confirmation has been obtained by SWD, they will refer your case to International Social Service (ISS) via fax.

How to get there:

- 2. Go to Exit C
- 3. Walk to Yau Ma Tei Community Centre (follow the arrows below) (~5mins)



International Social Service (ISS)

ISS will contact you and give an appointment for an in-take interview. (You may have to wait for a few weeks before you are given an in-take interview. You will not have access to material assistance during this time, however you may approach the ISS office for emergency food)

Once an ISS has conducted an in-take interview, and you fulfill the criteria, you will be provided with food support (HKD1200 per month) and rent support (HKD1500 per month).





Hospital / Doctor appointments

In order to receive free medical care, you need to be client of ISS and apply for a medical waiver prior to the appointment.

- 1. Seek an appointment at the desired medical facility.
- 2. Approach to closest Social Welfare Department office to obtain a medical waiver before you attend the medical centre. If your appointment is in the afternoon, please apply for a medical waiver on the day of your appointment in the morning. In case your appointment is in the morning, please apply for a waiver on the day before your appointment.
- 3. If your appointment is at the hospital or if you have been hospitalized, you should approach the Medical Social Work Unit of the hospital to obtain a medical waiver. You may ask the counter desk in the hospital to provide you the accurate directory.

However, in case of an emergency, the HK hospital will treat you even without a medical waiver!

Dental care

All dentists in Hong Kong are private and medical fees will not be waived. If it is a dental emergency you may try the hospital below. They only provide free or subsidized dental works that are currently in sync with their teaching schedule for the University.

Public transportation

In Hong Kong, people mostly use MTR, buses, taxis and the ferry to get around.

a. Octopus

The octopus card is a pass for the MTR which is slightly cheaper than the single tickets. There are different categories.





For the MTR, you tap the octopus card on the sensor to enter the paid area or to exit it. With buses and ferries, you only tap them when you enter. No need to tap again when you exit.

b. Single journey tickets

How to buy the single journey tickets?

- 1. Select your destination (tap the destination station on the screen).
- 2. Choose either Adult or Concessionary tickets.
- 3. If you want to buy 2 or more tickets, choose multiple and select the numbers.
- 4. Insert enough coins into the hole (see picture below).





Tap the ticket when you enter the paid area and insert it when you exit.

c. Cash

Only In the bus you can pay cash. The screen will tell you the amount of money you have to pay. Put the coins in the slot next to the bus driver. There won't be any change!
